Year 1


In year 1 we had a

Year 6

This term, at school, we have been completing many
exciting topics such as: an e-safety PowerPoint in
computing which was really fun and we got to write
interesting information and add our own animations
and transitions. We also had to adapt it to make it

In geography, we have learned about rivers from around
