It was lovely to see so many of you at the OPAL play date, even though it was a bit chilly!

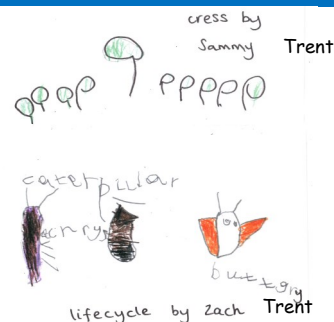
