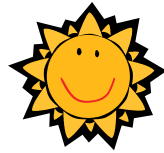

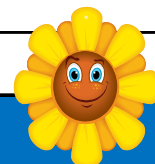

Thank you to you all for being so supportive.

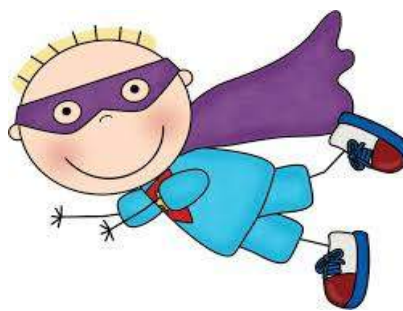
