This year has been very special with a successful Ofsted earlier in the year, many school visits have taken place and wonderful events in school.

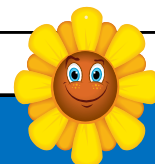
Our focus on reading has been successful with children completing challenges and doing well in their learning.
